The Greatest Issue in the Book of Revelation

In Revelation 12:17 we are reminded that the devil has destructive designs for those who follow God in the last days. Last night we discovered that one of the significant attacks of Satan through the Antichrist power will be an overhaul of God's own law. Tonight, we will discover what lies at the heart of God's law and Satan's scheming against it.

The Battle Over Worship

- Revelation 13:8—In the end of time, _____ is the central issue.
- Revelation 14:6-7—While Satan uses the Antichrist power to usurp worship, God's end-time message to the world is one that calls people to true worship of the One who _____ all things. This is one of the distinctive characteristics that sets God apart as worthy of our worship (cf. Rev. 4:11; Ps. 96:4-5).
- The reality that we often overlook is that when we honor God as Creator, we are in fact worshipping Jesus (cf. Eph. 3:9; Col. 1:16-18; John 1:1-4).
- We shouldn't be surprised, then, that part of Satan's attack at the end of time would be a frontal assault on any token that points to God as the Creator and inspires us to worship Him.
